WORK ON GLOBAL INTERNET GOVERNANCE IN PARIS

The Internet & Jurisdiction Policy Network addresses the tension between the cross-border Internet and national jurisdictions. Its Paris-based Secretariat facilitates a global multistakeholder policy process to enable transnational cooperation and preserve the global character of the Internet. Since 2012, the Internet & Jurisdiction Policy Network has engaged more than 200 key entities from different stakeholder groups around the world. The Internet & Jurisdiction Policy Network uniquely bridges relevant stakeholder groups and policy silos in order to enable transnational cooperation.

The Internet & Jurisdiction Policy Network strives to fill the institutional gap in Internet governance at the intersection of four policy silos: legal cooperation, digital economy, human rights, and cybersecurity. Through global, regional, and thematic meetings, Internet & Jurisdiction facilitates a neutral dialogue process to build trust among the different actors and help them develop the operational solutions necessary for the coexistence of diverse laws on the cross-border Internet.

The work of the Internet & Jurisdiction Policy Network has been featured in outlets such as The Economist, Politico, Washington Post, or Financial Times and presented to major international processes, including the G7 and G20. The Global Conferences of the Internet & Jurisdiction Policy Network are institutionally supported by the OECD, UNESCO, European Commission, the Council of Europe, and ICANN.

THE POSITION

We are looking for a dynamic intern with a keen interest in internet governance and multistakeholder cooperation. You will work with an innovative and successful internet governance secretariat in a fast-paced, global environment. We are based in Paris, France in a renovated factory near Canal St. Martin, and our working language is English. This is a paid internship (650 euro per month), and a partial public transportation cost reimbursement is also provided. The duration of the full-time internship is 6 months and will commence in April 2018 (Spring Internship).

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Support policy development work in the Data, Content and Domains programs through research, tasks, minutes and summaries
- Support the organization of events and meetings with key stakeholders
- Track and synthesize global internet and jurisdiction trends for the I&J Retrospect Database
- Prepare blog posts about events and activities, newsletters for circulation, and reports on meetings
- Develop and implement strategies to further the organization's online presence
- Support fundraising and outreach activities
- Support administrative and organizational processes of the Secretariat













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REQUIREMENTS

- Enrolled in master's or PhD program during the time of the internship (a requirement under French law) and eligible to complete an internship in France
- Specialized in policy, law, international relations, internet studies, or a related field
- General working knowledge of internet politics, law, and innovation, or a willingness to learn quickly
- Ideally a first prior work experience, preferably in a fast-paced or international environment (political institutions, law firms, internet companies, think tanks, etc.)
- Extracurricular engagement
- Excellent written and oral command of English (C2 level); other languages a plus
- Tech savvy (MS Word, PP, Excel, etc.)
- Very good organizational skills
- Autonomy, initiative, and attention to detail
