### THE TENSION

On the Internet, transnational interactions are becoming the new norm, while legal cooperation frameworks remain based upon the separation of national sovereignties.

New shared fair process frameworks are needed to govern interactions between governments, Internet platforms or operators, and users regarding in particular domain seizures, content takedowns and access to user data.

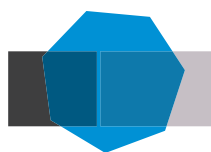
In 2013, four regional workshops in Rio, Paris, New Delhi and Washington DC prepared this IGF session.
